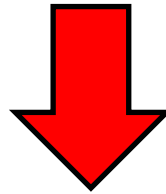


Why do we need Open Government ?



What is Open Government?

- People have the right to access the documents and proceedings of government.



- Government where citizens not only have access to information, documents, and proceedings, but can also become participants in a meaningful way
- Improved communication and operations within the various branches and levels of government for greater efficiency and accountability
